Join us in preserving art for the future—please do not touch the works of art.

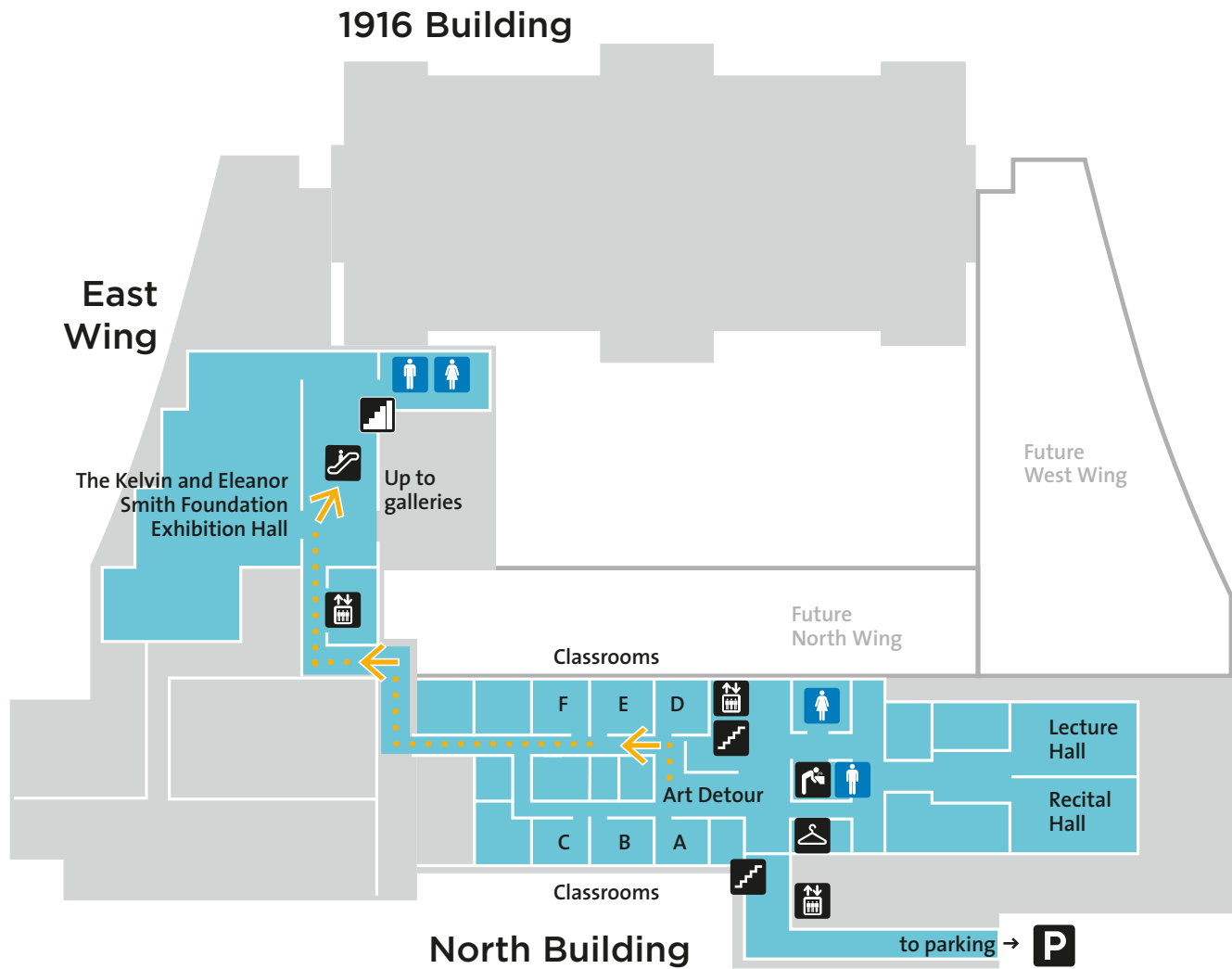

The Cleveland Museum of Art is generously funded by Cuyahoga County residents through Cuyahoga Arts and Culture.



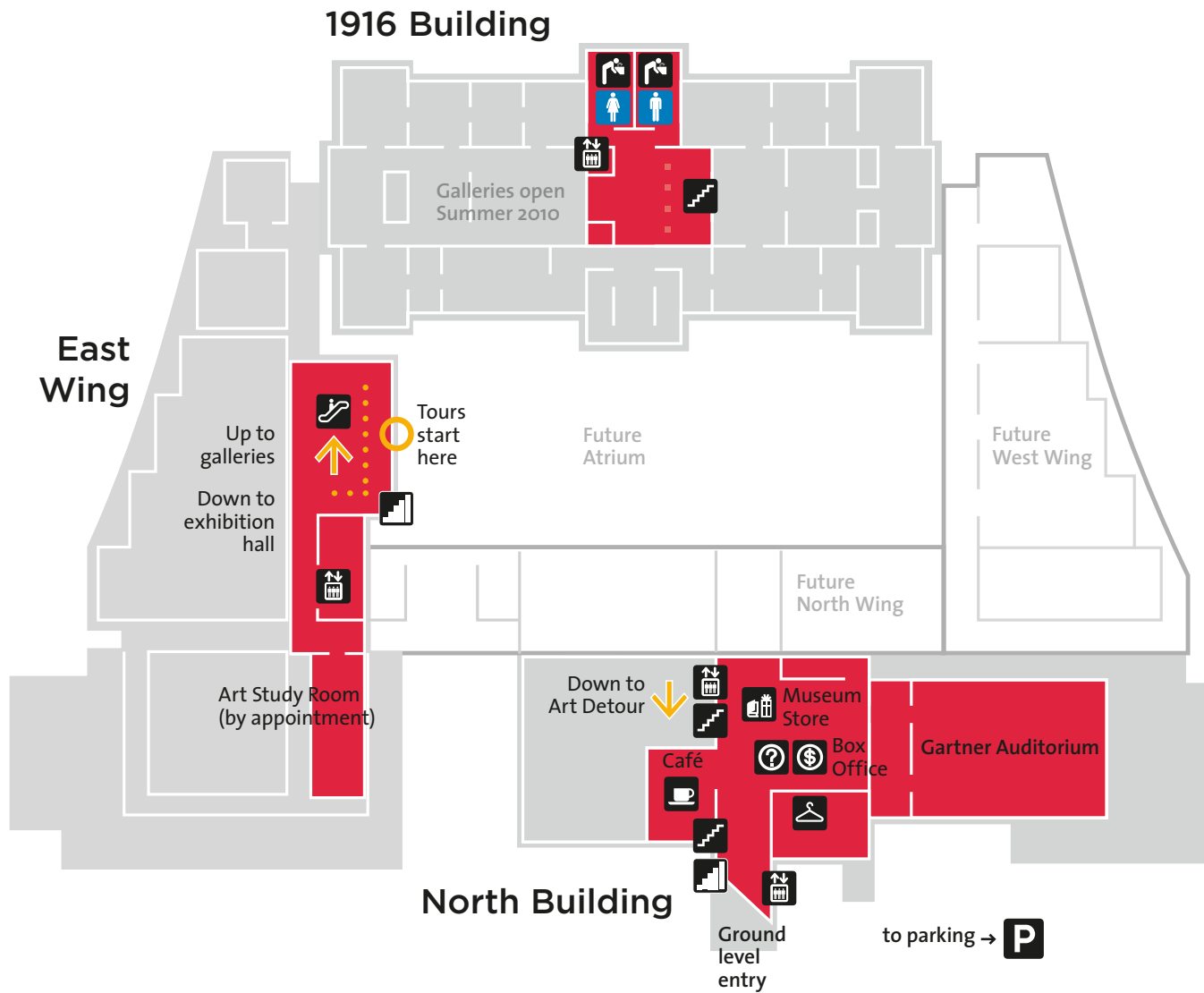
The Ohio Arts Council helped fund the museum with state tax dollars to encourage economic growth, educational excellence, and cultural enrichment for all Ohioans.

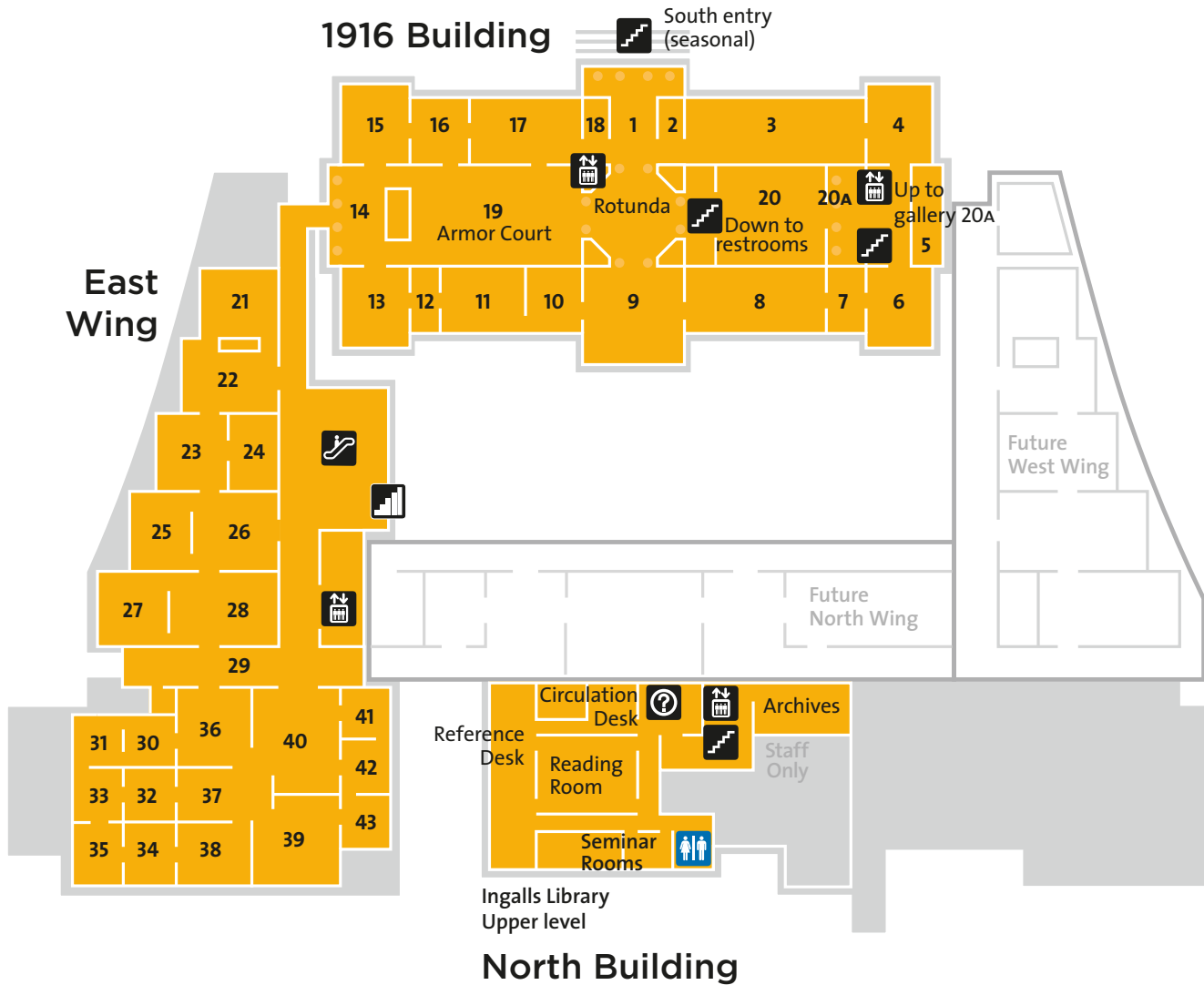
